In the academic year 2016-17 we received £8836. The money was spent to ensure that all five of the grant condition were fulfilled. The grant conditions are as follows:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

Competition SLA from Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP)	To allow access for all pupils to access a wide range of competitive events and opportunities to participate in different festivals with their peers including: gymnastics, dance, football, rugby, athletics, orienting, cricket, tennis and basketball.	100% of pupils in Y1 – Y6 represented the school over the academic year. Responses to pupil questionnaires show that 93% of pupils in KS2 feel they are given the opportunity to represent the school at tournaments and festivals. Enhanced SLA from Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP)	Provides pupils with 30 hours of specialised coaching – focused on dance, gymnastics, net and wall games, fundamental movement skills, athletics and striking and fielding games. 9 CPD courses provided for staff members to improve staff understanding in all areas of the PE curriculum including: subject leader modules, strength and conditioning, dance, gymnastics, raising achievement in English and Maths through PE. Gifted and Talented programme for 6 Y5/6 pupils – workshops on agility, co-ordination, nutrition and leadership. Leadership Course for pupils - Sports Leaders Playmaker Programme. PE Health Check – thorough subject inspection from SSP – focusing on strengths and areas for development across the subject. Multi-skills tournaments – tournaments for every pupil in each class to participate in and compete against local schools.
