

# Sedgefield Hardwick Sport Premium Impact



2018-19

In the academic year 2018-19 we received £17820. The money was spent to fulfil the following grant conditions:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

Competition SLA from Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP)	This allowed all pupils to access a wide range of competitive events and opportunities. They participated in different festivals with their peers including: gymnastics, dance, swimming, football, rugby, athletics, orienting, cricket, tennis, multi skills (available for every class) and basketball.	Every pupil from Reception class to Year 6 represented the school at an external sporting event. In a pupil questionnaire 97% of pupils stated they were proud to represent Sedgefield Hardwick at sporting events.	Further intra-school competitions, using the rules and format from the SSP tournaments, can be created to increase competitive sport pupils have access to. The SSOC (School Sport Organising Crew) used the drills in the SSP multi skills festivals in lunchtime activities for KS1 pupils.	4, 5,	£1530
Enhanced SLA from Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP)	Provided pupils with 30 hours of specialised coaching – focused on dance, gymnastics, fundamental movement skills and invasion games. Coaches planned with staff prior to the block of coaching so that staff were given the opportunity to observe good practise, team teach and then, towards the end of the block, take the lead, with the coach adopting an observational role. All staff members had access to specialist coaching at some point during the year. 15 hours of bespoke support helped members of staff who had highlighted other areas of practice they wish to develop. The EYFS programme – Move with Max – ensured that Reception pupils had a specially designed curriculum, targeting their fundamental movement skills. Fit for Life complemented our Active10 programme and gave pupils a wider range of exercise to use to keep fit and healthy.	Staff questionnaire responses stated that 100% of teachers felt the specialist coaching blocks had improved their understanding of how to structure and reshape a PE lesson. 91% of pupils from Y1 to Y6 were attaining in line with our expectations.	CPD and team teaching has allowed staff to improve their pedagogy – particularly in regard to invasion games and dance - which they will be able to use independently in the next academic year.	2, 3, 4, 5	£4672

Sport Apprentice position	Supported the teaching of PE across the school – particularly supporting the LAP and challenging the HAP. Ran lunch time activities to engage a wide variety of pupils in a number of different sports. Worked with the School Sport Organising Crew to aid the running of intra school competitions. Supported staff in running inter school festivals and competitions – trials, extra training and support at the events. Ran the Change4Life clubs. Provided bespoke tournament coaching so that pupils fully understood the rules and format of the competition they were entering and gave them an opportunity to train prior to the event.	100% of staff stated that they found a PE apprentice to be extremely beneficial. Pupils stated that they liked having an apprentice as they could, “Help us to improve by making games harder and more competitive.” 100% of pupils from the Change4Life groups stated that they were now more engaged in sport.	Pupils will continue to build on their existing skills by exploring more leadership opportunities in the next academic year – within the PE lesson, as play leaders, as members of the SSOC (School Sport Organising Crew), in Change4Life and in organising intra-school tournaments.	1, 3, 4,	£10000 contribution to wage
