- planning or saying out loud what I am going to write about

I can make simple additions, revisions and corrections to my own writing by:

- evaluating my writing with the teacher and other pupils
- re-reading to check that my writing makes sense and that verbs to indicate time are used correctly and consistently, including verbs in the continuous form
- proof-reading to check for errors in spelling, grammar and punctuation (e.g. ends of sentences punctuated correctly)
- reading aloud what I have written with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.
