

# Sedgefield Hardwick Sport Premium Impact



2019-20

In the academic year 2019-20 we received £18,110. The money was spent to fulfil the following grant conditions:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

Competition SLA from Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP)	This allowed access for all pupils to access a wide range of competitive events and opportunities, participating in different festivals with their peers including gymnastics, dance, swimming, football, rugby, sports hall athletics, multi skills (available for every class), a colour run and basketball.	Every pupil from Reception class to Year 6 represented the school at an external sporting event prior to lockdown. In a pupil questionnaire 100% of pupils stated they were proud to represent Sedgefield Hardwick at sporting events. 97% of pupils surveyed also stated that they felt they were able to access a wide range of sporting competitions and festivals.	Further intra-school competitions, using the rules and format from the SSP tournaments, have been created by the SSOC (School Sport Organising Crew) to increase competitive sport pupils have access to. Enhanced SLA from Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP)	Provided pupils with 22.5 hours (originally slated to be 30 hours prior to COVID-19) of specialised coaching – focused on dance, gymnastics, fundamental movement skills and invasion games. Coaches planned with staff for 1 hour prior to each lesson in the block of coaching so that staff were given the opportunity to formulate a lesson structure together. The coach then adopted a facilitator role, allowing the teacher to lead the lesson but always being available to support the teacher as and when required. All staff members had access to specialist coaching at some point during the year prior to lockdown. 7.5 hours of bespoke support provided help to the subject leader to develop curriculum end points which staff could use to accurately assess pupils in each year group. The 'Big Events Bundle' allowed pupils to enjoy a new experience – a whole school colour run. Participation in other large-scale celebratory events such as the Sedgefield Dash and the Primary Olympics were cancelled due to COVID-19.	Staff questionnaire responses stated that 100% of teachers felt the specialist coaching blocks had improved their understanding of how to structure and reshape a PE lesson. Staff comments about the coach (who worked with staff over 2 terms) included, 'Superb support and ideas which I have used in subsequent PE planning and delivery.'
