

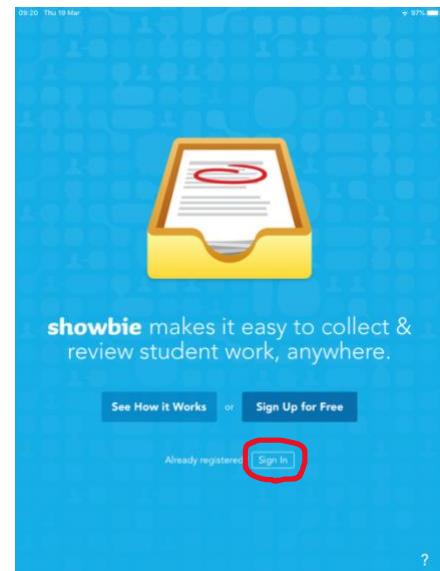
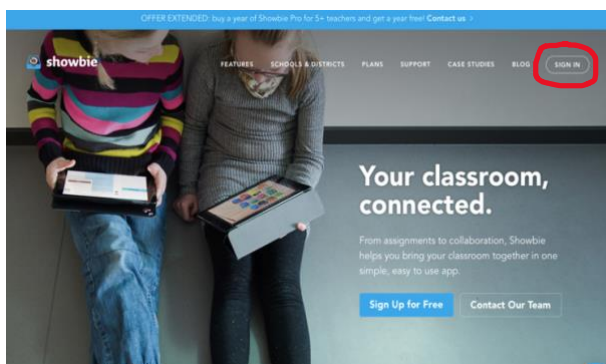

Showbie

In November, when the Year 1 bubble isolated for 2 weeks, your child's remote learning was issued via email. From Wednesday 6th January, your child's remote learning will be issued through the Showbie website (www.showbie.com) or app (available on the Apple App Store). Below are the steps to take to access their English and Maths and their e-books.

1. Please select the **'Sign in'** option (indicated by the red circle on images below) rather than the 'Sign up for free' option.
2. Sign in using your child's username and password (**this will be provided for you in a separate email**).
3. Select your child's year group.
4. Select the Phonics, Maths, E-Book or Remote Learning folder.
5. Select the Phonics, Maths, E-Book or Remote Learning assignment.
6. Select Shared Items.
7. Select the appropriate lesson.



Please contact your child's class teacher if your child cannot log on to the Showbie website or app.

Oak National Academy

Pupils will complete their foundation subjects, like Computing, Science, History and Geography, through the Oak National Academy website. Teachers will paste a link to the lesson that they wish your child to complete that day into the Remote Learning folder on Showbie. Please click on the link

and then work through the lesson on the Oak National Academy website. The lesson will include an interactive video to watch and then an end of lesson quiz to check pupils' understanding.
